observing the Government guidelines and the one-way system, and my particular thanks to our new temporary Assistant Virger, Tom Mendel, and to Fr Jonathan and Simon (directing operations from a distance!) for all the practical arrangements which have allowed us to welcome people safely back into the building.

We look forward in due course to being able to offer public worship again (though doubtless still with restrictions in place), but are delighted that so many of you continue to join us week by week for our online Eucharist, and also for Zoom Morning Prayer at 9 am during the week. As Helen prepares to return to work after her maternity leave, Fr Jonathan will be working part-time (60%) in order to spend more time with Caspar, so from 23rd June until the autumn he will be serving the parish on Thursdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays. (This pattern may change or adapt slightly as we come out of

lockdown.) He will, of course, continue to offer his many gifts sharing in the preparation and leading of our online worship - and our worship in church when that comes - and in our pastoral care and outreach.

Hand sanitizer will be provide by the door, you must use this when you enter the church t help protect our more vulnerable parishioners. The back \mathfrak{c}^3 . the church will be roped off, but the front of the church an the two chapels are available for you to sit and pray. Pleas be very aware of others praying and avoid sitting near t them. If possible do not use the ends of the pews as thi tends to be where everyone sits and it will leave you closer t those passing in the aisle. We must maintain a 2 metre distance from other individuals at all times. We can only remain open if we can provide a safe environment in which people follow the above guidance. We look forward to seeing you back in the church.

NHS Test and Trace - your help is needed

Free tests are now available on the NHS for anyone showing symptoms of Coronavirus

If you have one or more symptoms of coronavirus, which are a high temperature, a new, continuous cough, or a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia), you must immediately self-isolate. You then must book a test using nhs.uk/coronavirus or call 119. Testing is now available for anyone who has

If you test positive, you will be **contacted by NHS Test and Trace** who will help you identify who you have been in contact with and will gather their contact details. You must isolate for 7 days. People identified as having been in close contact with someone who has a positive test must stay at home for 14 days, even if they do not have symptoms.
