St Mary Abbots will re-open for public worship on Sunday 12th July! We look forward very much to welcoming you back to our services.

Due to Government and church guidelines, there will initially be a limited pattern of services and numbers will be restricted at any one act of worship, (see below), but we hope with ongoing online services as well, there will be plenty of opportunities for everyone to pray and give thanks to God in the way they find most helpful at this time. We hope to see you soon!

We are putting in place a system to allow us to hold our first act of public worship in the church on the 12th July at 8am, 9.30am and 11.15am. As there is a limit of 30 people for any one service you will need to sign up on eventbrite. The link for this will be available next week and sent to you by email and on our website.

MORNING PRAYER ON ZOOM: We will continue to hold the **9am** zoom meeting for morning prayer on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. If you would be interested in joining us please email Mother Emma <u>vicar@smaw8.org</u> who will send you the invitation.

PRAYER DURING THE DAY

We will be offering a short act of public prayer at noon, Monday – Saturday beginning on 13^{th} July. The Eucharist will be celebrated immediately afterwards on Tuesday and Thursdays beginning on 14^{th} and 16^{th} July.

PRIVATE PRAYER: The church will be open for private prayer on Monday - Saturday from 10am – 2pm and on Sundays from 2pm - 6pm. Access will only be possible through the cloisters and the south door. Opening the church is dependent upon our maintenance of good practices including:

- maintaining 2 metre distancing from others
- following the one way system
- sanitising our hands at the entrance

The back of the church will be roped off, but the front of the church and the two chapels are available for you to sit and pray. Please be very aware of others praying and avoid sitting near to them. If possible do not use the ends of the pews as this tends to be where everyone sits and it will leave you closer to those passing in the aisle.

EVENING PRAYER: The Clergy will continue to say evening prayer in the quiet of their homes **every evening at 5.30 pm**. Archbishops Phoneline "Daily Hope" - Update

covering Holland, Campden and Pembridge wards.

The phoneline, Daily Hope, which was set up by Archbishop Justin Welby and backed by the Archbishop's Council, is a phone line for those who wish to worship but cannot use the internet. Callers receive a welcome from Archbishop Justin and then a series of options including a choice of well-known hymns and morning and evening prayer. The Line has received over 150,000 calls totalling 1.7 million minutes from nearly 38,000 unique callers and the feedback has been hugely positive. One message reads: My mum is 89 and suffers from macular degeneration. She is living alone nearly 200 miles from us, without internet access, and, like many at this time, is feeling extremely depressed and isolated. A few weeks ago I told her about the phone line 'Daily Hope'. I can't begin to tell you how much she appreciates this initiative. It has brought her such comfort, and I know that she spends many hours listening to it, particularly in the night when she's unable to sleep.
