We will be offering a short act of public prayer at noon, Monday Saturday beginning on 13th July. The Eucharist will be celebrated immediately afterwards on Tuesday and Thursdays beginning on 14th and 16th July.

#### **CHURCH ACCESS**

Access will only be possible through the cloisters and the south door. Opening the church is dependent upon our maintenance of good practices including:

- maintaining 2 metre distancing from others
- following the one way system
- sanitising our hands at the entrance

The back of the church will be roped off, but the front of the church and the two chapels are available for you to sit and pray. Please be very aware of others praying and avoid sitting near to them. If possible do not use the ends of the pews as this tends to be where everyone sits and it will leave you closer to those passing in the aisle.

## **Message from Mother Emma**

First, a reminder of the joyful news that St Mary Abbots will re-open for public worship on Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> July! We look forward very much to welcoming you back to the church.

On Sunday 12th July we shall initially be offering three services:

8 am Holy Communion (BCP)

9.30 am Parish Eucharist (preacher: Alice Ormondroyd)

Provision for accompanied children in the Long

Playground

11.15 am Matins (preacher: The Revd Emma Dinwiddy

Smith)

Due to Government guidelines, there will still be certain limitations to our worship; in particular we are asked not to include any congregational singing, but our worship will be enhanced by the organ and by a solo Cantor at our two principal services. Full details from the guidelines will be sent out next week and announced at the start of each service.

We are asked to maintain a record of attenders for "track and trace" purposes, and there will be a limit on the numbers permitted to attend (though it is still unclear at this point exactly what this will be - I shall be confirming this in my message next week). We are therefore asking if you could sign up for the service you are planning to attend via Eventbrite, to enable us to monitor both numbers and contacts, using the links on our website <a href="https://www.smaw8.org">www.smaw8.org</a>

In the meantime, we hope very much that you will be able to **join us online this Sunday at 10.30 am** for our monthly Family Eucharist (by email and on our website), as we welcome our new Curate, Alice Ormondroyd, to the parish. Our thanks, as always, to the children who have contributed to this service by reading and praying, and to all who have so faithfully supported our online worship week by week over this period, or who have continued to study and pray at home.

We hope to be able to record a Sunday service in church in the weeks ahead, and to continue to make them available each week on our website and YouTube channel for those who remain shielding or self-isolated - please watch this space!
