Below is a message from Fr Jonathan, whose time at St Mary Abbots is drawing to a close. There will be many opportunities to wish Jonathan, Helen and Caspar well and to thank them warmly for everything they have brought to St Mary Abbots over the past three years, but in particular, please do make a note of the 9.30 am and 11.15 am services on Sunday 20 September, when Fr Jonathan will be both presiding and preaching for a final time. He will also be giving a brief reflection on his time here at the APCM on Wednesday 16th September. We hold the MacNeaney family in our thoughts and prayers as they prepare to move and are grateful for everything they have given us.

#### Father Jonathan's Message to St Mary Abbots

"Here at my feet what wonders pass, what endless, active life is here!" Lines written by Matthew Arnold

I write to you a month ahead of my departure. Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> September will be my final day leading worship in the parish concluding my ministry here of three years and three months. I can't say where I'm going next or where I'll be living or ministering but we trust in the Spirit and make do with the cares of today.

When I first arrived I looked out on the congregation from my first Sunday at the front and felt the weight of the lives hidden behind the east-turned faces. In these last three years it has been my privilege to travel with and explore your endless, active lives.

For those of you who were quick to share with me your hopes and sorrows, your prayers and your fears – thank you. For those who have cared for me and doted on me, my mother would like to say thank you!

I will leave with a host of warm-hearted memories: The bell that chimed five minutes before morning prayer, telling me I had enough time to finish brushing my teeth, force on my shoes and get to church (as long as I did so at a gentle jog). I must have been one of the few workers in London summoned to work by public alarm. The opportunity to minister to every person from every walk of life. Most wonderfully demonstrated by the gentle snores of those sleeping in the church that became audible in the lull between verses, as we processed past the Prime Minister. St Mary Abbots School - its pupils, staff and parents. For all the fun we have had together and the stupid things you've been willing to do to keep my assemblies on track. The unremitting worshipping life that gets under your skin. Our unwillingness to back down from a rich diet of sacrament, prayer and praise. Indeed my greatest sadness in leaving is that we did not get to celebrate a full Easter this year. The full Triduum, as celebrated at St Mary Abbots, competes for the title of closest I've been to heaven.

But mostly I'll remember the lives that you shared with me. The joys of new life, the milestones we have marked in individuals' lives and the life of the church and school but moreover the pain we have shared. It is in the darkest moments that I believe the gospel has the most to speak. The journeys of pain, suffering, death and resurrection that you have invited me to walk with you have been your greatest gift to me. If we have anything to say as Christians it is that:

Christ once raised from the dead dies no more ♦ death has no more dominion over him.

In dying he died to sin once for all ◆ in living he lives to God. See yourselves therefore as dead to sin ◆ and alive to God in Jesus Christ our Lord.

I hope I have been an example to you of this, our Easter hope. Jonathan, 20<sup>th</sup> August 2020
