

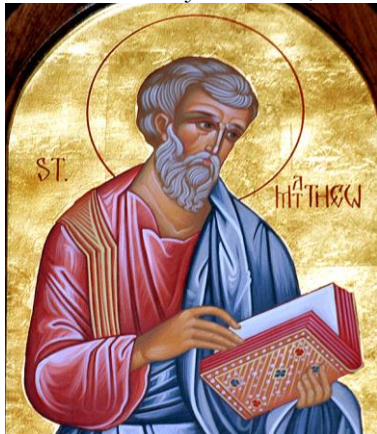
## In Our Prayers This Week

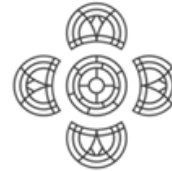
