#### **Message from Mother Emma**

Further to my message yesterday, I am writing with further information - though with the proviso that things continue to change or be clarified, so please continue to follow the website for up-to-date information.



The church remains open for private prayer from 10 am to 2 pm every day, Monday to Sunday.

This coming Sunday (9th November) is Remembrance Sunday, and we are very aware that marking this during lockdown will be like no other Remembrance Day before, which will be disappointing for many. However, we are glad to be able to offer an online service of Choral Matins with an Act of Remembrance, to remember and honour all those who lives have been lost or changed forever in war or on active service.

The service will go live on our YouTube channel just after 10.50 am, so that we can share in the two-minute silence observed across the nation at 11 am. Our readers for this service will be Sir Peter Marshall and the Deputy Mayor of RBKC, Councillor Sof McVeigh. I am grateful to our professional choir for recording the music in advance of the lockdown; to Molly Dineen for her help with filming and to Leonora for putting the service together.

We hope very much that you will join us online for this service.

Sadly, our new children's provision at St Mary Abbots Centre, which was due to be launched this week has now had to be postponed. However, thanks to Martina, Mother Alice and a number of our parish children, we shall be providing a special online service for our children, which could be viewed alongside the Remembrance Day Service, after it or at any other time! We will be announcing our plans for children's ministry during the remainder of lockdown in my email next week

It is hard to see our churches closed once again for worship, but we give thanks that this time round, our buildings can at least remain open for individual prayer. The Archbishops of Canterbury and York recognise the sadness many of us feel at being deprived of sacramental worship for a time. They have called for this lockdown month to be a National Month of Prayer from home, with those who are able fasting in whatever way seems appropriate each Thursday. They have suggested that at 6 pm, those who can might like to pray briefly on their doorstep each evening, using the national prayer points shown below. We shall also be incorporating these in our Zoom service of Morning Prayer at 9 am each morning (please let me know if you would like to be sent the link) and you might wish to include them if you visit the church to make your own private prayers.

#### National prayer points:

Sunday Family, friends and loved ones

Monday Schools and colleges, children and young people

Tuesday Elderly, isolated and vulnerable

Wednesday Businesses, the workplace and economic

wellbeing, all whose jobs have ended or are at risk

Thursday The NHS and other key workers Friday National and local governments

Saturday All who are grieving and all suffering with physical

and mental ill-health

I also share with you once again the Church of England's prayer for all those affected by the virus:

Keep us, good Lord, under the shadow of your mercy. Sustain and support the anxious, be with those who care for the sick, and lift up all who are brought low; that we may find comfort knowing that nothing can separate us from your love in Christ Jesus our Lord. **Amen.**

## Extracts from a letter from Archbishops Justin and Stephen and Bishop Sarah

"This is a difficult and challenging time for all of us. We are sure that some of you reading this letter will wish we had made other decisions during the period of the first lockdown, or even challenged the government harder on the decisions it has made. You may be right. However, it is our view that the best way we can serve our nation now is by pouring our energy into doing the things that we can do, which is to pray and to serve. We also dare to hope that we will be kind to each other and that God will give us the courage and humility we need to be faithful witnesses to the gospel of peace".

"More than anything else we know that we are in the faithful hands of the risen Christ who knows our weaknesses, tiredness and struggles and whose steadfast love endures for ever".

"In one of the climactic passages of the New Testament, Paul says to those who follow Christ that their "love must be genuine, that they hate what is evil and hold fast to what is good." He asks them to "serve the lord", exhorting them to "rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers." (See Romans 12.9-12.) None of this is easy. Especially not at the moment. But it is our calling."
