Message from Mother Emma

We are now in the season of Epiphany when we commemorate the revealing of Christ to the world. As we wrestle with the prospect of a third lockdown, we hope and pray that this will be the last, and we commit ourselves to keeping one another safe, and to revealing Christ's healing love in our own lives and relationships.



Grant us, Lord, who behold your glory, to drink from the waters of the new creation flowing from the river of life in your baptism. Give us the wings of the Spirit, that we may hasten to meet you at your coming and praise you, with the Father and the Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen Common Worship, Times and Seasons, 2006

As you will have seen, the Government guidelines for this current lockdown tell us that churches may remain open for both public worship and private prayer, provided that this can be done as safely as possible. We are very aware that the church brings immense comfort to many at this dark time, and we hope very much to be able to continue to provide opportunities for both, though with a few restrictions. The PCC Standing Committee and clergy have committed themselves to watching very carefully the level of safety we are able to achieve and we do ask for your help with this as we continue to follow Government guidelines together. Please remember the importance of mask-wearing, hand-sanitising and social distancing - and of course, please do not attend if you have any symptoms of Covid-19, or have been asked to isolate. In addition, (even though we are deeply sorry for the diminishing of contact this entails), we ask you to leave the church as promptly as possible after the services, alone or within your family bubble. The Archbishop of Canterbury also reminds us that those in the more vulnerable groups should carefully consider the risks involved before attending church or travelling.

I regret to say that there will be NO 8 am Eucharist this week, as we assess the pattern for moving forward. However, the 9.30 Eucharist will be taken by the Revd Dana English, who took our Christmas services. Revd Dana will also preach at our 11.15 service of Matins (with Cantor), while Mother Alice will lead the service. At all services, we shall be commemorating the Baptism of Christ by John the Baptist in the River Jordan. An online children's service has also been put together, the link for which will be sent out by Martina.

In addition to this, I shall be offering a service of Morning Prayer online on Sunday morning at 10.30 am via Zoom for anyone who would like to join this. I will send the link to anyone who has joined in a service of Morning Prayer before, but do hope that if you would like to share in this service for the first service (or know of someone else who might), you will contact me for the link.

We hope that in these ways, as many of you as possible will be able to share in our worship this week. If you have any feedback, please do let me know. While we are constricted by some regulations and by staff shortages (not least my being confined to my home by the current Government rules!), we are keen to enable helpful ways for you to engage with God.

On a different and very sad note, some of you may have heard that Rosemary MacNeaney, mother of Fr Jonathan, our former Assistant Vicar, passed away with Covid on New Year's Day. Finding Jesus in the Storm

John Swinton, Professor of Practical Theology and Pastoral Care at the University of Aberdeen joins Paula Gooder, Chancellor of St Paul's Cathedral and leading Biblical Scholar to discuss how best to take care of our mental and spiritual health, even in times of uncertainty, loss and change. "When Jesus says I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full, he doesn't say that means it will be without suffering. Fullness of life speaks of joy, hope and resurrection, but life in all its fullness is not life without pain or disappointment: Jesus's own life wasn't. The pandemic has been a storm unlike anything we have experienced before. As we have faced illness, bereavement, mental health challenges and radical change all of us have been affected by events we couldn't control".
