#### **Message from Mother Emma**

It was lovely to worship with many of you last Sunday as the snow fell gently outside, but the snowdrops and the slowly lightening evenings do also bring the first hint of the promise of Spring. As I have mentioned in my sermon this week, Candlemas (which we shall celebrate this Sunday) used to mark the last



day on which the streetlamps were lit, as after that it was thought there was enough light in the sky to find the way home from work at 5 pm - a very encouraging thought!

I sense from my phone calls and messages that many of us are tired and weary from the long lockdown and saddened by the tragic news of so many deaths; some of them people known to us. Please be assured that you and your families are held in the prayers of the church, together with the sick and the bereaved, as we continue to support each other in the love of Christ through this crisis. I am very aware of the warmth and support which members of the congregation are experiencing from one another, and hope that you would always feel free to ask if we could find further help, or to offer support. Although we cannot currently take in Foodbank donations, we know that financial donations to Foodbank are being very much appreciated by the many whose livelihoods have been affected by the crisis, and the details of how to give can be found in the newsletter on the website.

Candlemas marks the turning-point between Christmas and Easter; as we prepare to walk the difficult road to the Cross, we can be conscious of the promise of Christ's Resurrection at the end of the journey and find light and hope even in the darkest times.

We hope that you will be able to join us to worship God again this Sunday, whether for Morning Prayer on Zoom, or for the online Eucharist with music and sermon <a href="https://www.smaw8.org/services">www.smaw8.org/services</a> or for the children's provision which Martina will be telling you about. The church remains open for private prayer for some time every day and you are very welcome to rest, pray or light a candle as you pass.
