Message from Mother Emma

We are approaching the start of Lent, and are sorry that we shall not be able to mark the beginning of the season in person together this year, though we have high hopes that we will be able to worship together again as we move towards Holy Week and Easter. I am grateful to report that I have now received my first dose of the vaccine, so look forward to my release from the Vicarage in due course! Once the Prime Minister has set out his plans for the country's end to lockdown, we shall also be confirming our plans for re-opening the church for public worship before too long. I hope, however, that you will be able to join us as we mark Shrove Tuesday and Ash Wednesday online next week as the season begins.



On Tuesday 16th February, we shall be holding a Zoom Pancake Party for all ages, beginning at 4.30 pm with a reminder of what Shrove Tuesday is all about, and then followed by games, quizzes – and the opportunity to share online our pancake-making efforts from our own kitchens!! On Ash Wednesday (17th Feb), there will be an online service with readings, prayers, a reflection and music from our professional choir, which will be available from 12 noon on our YouTube channel via our website www.smaw8.org/services. There will also be a service for children – details to follow early next week. At both these services, there will be the opportunity to join together in ashing our foreheads as a reminder of our mortality and a sign of our penitence, and our desire to follow Christ more closely. Traditionally, the ashes used on Ash Wednesday are made by burning the palm crosses blessed during Palm Sunday the previous year. If you have any palm crosses at home, you may wish (with extreme caution!) to burn these in preparation for the services. We will also be making a few envelopes of ash and leaving them in the church for collection if needed.

During Lent, we would invite you to take part in two projects as part of your Lenten observance this year; one is a "Lenten Letter" which you can read about below. The other is a regular Lenten activity or act of kindness for families and children, which can also be obtained from Martina.

Lenten Letters – Volunteers Needed

At Christmas many of you very generously helped with our Christmas giving initiative to very isolated elderly people in the parish, by buying them gifts and delivering a food hamper at Christmas. For the last 20 years we have shared this mission with Christ Church and St George's. However loneliness and isolation doesn't end with Christmas, especially during another lockdown.

Throughout the period of Lent (6 weeks) we are looking for volunteers to send a letter each week of Lent. You will be provided with 6 letters of inspiration and envelopes designed to bring a smile to their face, and all you need to do is write a short cover note and drop it into their letter box. There is also a list of conversation ideas and pointers should you be able to call them. This way we can continue to bring happiness to the 79 who we were collectively in touch with at Christmas and make them feel remembered.

If you prefer the idea of more practical volunteering we will be connecting with Social Services to discover other needs of their 'service users' and find a way of offering practical help. This is a way to make a genuine, meaningful difference in the life of someone who truly needs it. It will make you feel wonderful!
