

Diocese of London – Lent Appeal Challenging Youth Violence

This year the Diocese of London is helping to tackle youth violence and the issues that cause it by supporting 3 amazing charities. Young people aged from 10 to 24 are using physical force to hurt or threaten other children or bystanders and the Charites aim to help stop this vicious cycle:

XLP (the EXceL Project): Started by Headmaster Patrick Regan after the stabbing of a pupil, this charity works with students and teachers to help with behavioural issues in school using education, mentoring, sport and Arts.

TLG (Transforming Lives for Good): using a network of churches this charity looks at the reasons for school exclusions, emotional wellbeing and holiday hunger.

Redthread: a charity that puts youth workers into A&E units in London and the Midlands. They aim to improve children's experiences when they come to the hospital or their experience of dealing with professional resources.
