Message from Mother Emma

Mother Alice and I were so happy to be able to welcome you back into church for our Mothering Sunday services last Sunday! It was wonderful to see everyone again – and we were specially impressed by all the fantastic mother-and-child reader and intercessor teams who led our worship at the Family Eucharist. Many thanks, too, to Martina for her hard work in arranging those parts of the service, and to everyone who worked to prepare the church to welcome us back.

This Sunday we shall be back in church again for Passion Sunday, as we veil the crosses in preparation for the solemnity of Passiontide and Holy Week. We do hope you will be able to join us at one of our three services (or at Evening Prayer online); please don't forget to sign up on Eventbrite to make sure you get a place.

I am delighted to announce more good news this week – the appointment of a new Associate Vicar, who will be joining us in early June. Fr Christopher Rogers is currently serving as Assistant Curate at St John the Baptist, Catford. Fr Christopher was a barrister from 2004-2015, before training at Westcott House for ordination. He brings many gifts to the parish team, among them experience of social outreach, ecumenism and the arts. We shall be inviting him to introduce himself in more detail closer to his arrival, but look forward very much to welcoming him here before too long!

As we move towards the ending of the lockdown, many feeling tired. exhausted or full of sadness after the past year, let us together find hope in God's promises.
