Message from Father Christopher

Over the last couple of months we have heard many stories from our new Afghan neighbours of the kindness and compassion of the British soldiers and other service personnel who helped them to leave Kabul Airport. One father described how after four days in the 'queue' to be processed, they reached the front just as the processing point was closed. A soldier however took the decision to re-open the gates for his family to get through.



As Christians we are a people of hope. It can be hard to maintain that in the face of the scenes of violence that we continue to see from around the world, whether Sudan, the Tigray region of Ethiopia or Syria. But the kindness of individuals, like that soldier, and the sacrifice which our armed forces continue to make for the sake of peacekeeping and humanitarian assistance is something we continue to give thanks for, just as we do for those who paid the ultimate price in all the conflicts of the last century or so. As well as our usual Eucharists and Evensong, this year we meet at 10.55 by our war memorial to honour the fallen, before our civic Remembrance Service, which you are very welcome to join us for.

As we begin to look forward to Advent and Christmas, we are delighted to announce the return of our Christmas Fair, which has moved from the **20th November to 27th November**. If you are able to bake cakes or help in setting up, running a stall or clear up in preparation for our Advent service on the 28th then please let Leonora know.
