#### Message from Mother Emma

This has been a poignant week for us all, as we have honoured the memory of Her Late Majesty The Queen, and prayed for our new King at his Proclamation. It has been a time to remember before God the late Queen's deep faith, her acts of service, humility and



duty, her compassion and inspiration. Here at St Mary Abbots, Prayers were offered on the first day of national mourning, attended by the Mayor, the Mayoress, Deputy Mayor and Lady Arnold DL and by members of our congregations and others. Our doors have been open for those who wanted to grieve and to remember in a sacred space, and many have come to light candles and to write in the Book of Remembrance.

Our Patronal Festival was postponed out of respect for this deeply-felt period of mourning, but we were touched and grateful that the Archdeacon of Middlesex came to lead our Parish Eucharist in memory of Her Late Majesty, and that we were able to come together as a community, including local MPs and Councillors, to remember and to give thanks for God's faithful servant.

This Sunday evening at 5.30 pm, instead of the previously advertised Taizé Eucharist, we shall be holding a Vigil Evensong with Lighting of Candles in memory of Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II on the Eve of her Funeral. This will be attended by the Mayor and Civic Representatives, and you are warmly invited to join us.

At our 9.30 am Parish Eucharist, we are delighted to welcome Dimitri, Isla and Ilaria as they are baptized into God's Church, together with their friends and families.

Looking ahead, we are pleased to say that the Victorian Society's talk on the life and works of Sir George Gilbert Scott will take place on Thursday 21st September at 6.30. Tickets are £10 and can be brought <u>HERE</u>, with wine available to purchase after the talk.

However, in the light of recent events and the limited time left to prepare, we have decided to postpone our Victorian Fun Fair which was due to take place on Saturday 24th September. We shall be combining this with our Christmas Fair on 26th November and will bring together our celebrations of our 150th Anniversary (together with the games, entertainment and food which would have been around at that time!), with those of the beginning of our preparations for the coming of the Christchild at Christmas. Leonora is very keen to hear from anyone able to help on that day, or help in advance.

On a personal note, may I send my heartfelt thanks to all who have sent thoughts, prayers and cards following my surgery. I hope to be making a gradual return to the church before too long.
