I am sure we have all found the last couple of weeks hard in different ways, but it has been a privilege to see the church being used by the wider local community: for quiet prayer, as people have continued to come in to light candles, pray and sign our book of condolence; as well as the larger



civic services we have held, with the Mayor, council and others attending, along with hundreds of local people. The staff team here have worked particularly hard to ensure that we have been there to help our community mourn, which we are all hugely grateful for. As mentioned by Mother Emma last week we have decided to postpone this weekend's **Victorian Fun Day**, which will now be combined with our Christmas Fair later in the year.

In this period we have also started our **Homeless Ministry**, meeting at the church at 6 every Monday evening, and taking hot food and drink to people in the High Street. If you would like to join us or learn more please do let me know.

We are pushing again for hosts for **Ukrainian refugees** too, as some of the initial hosts are no longer able to continue hosting. Again, please do get in touch with me if this is something you are interested in – it is particularly important for the sake of children who have started in local schools that they are able to stay in the area if possible.

Sunday 2nd October is our **Harvest Festival**, where any food items bought will be given to The Upper Room, a food bank and homeless Charity in West London. Please do bring dried, tinned or other non-perishable food to church for the service - a more detailed list can be found below.

Finally, on Friday 7th October a group of us are **sleeping out** in Duke of York Square in support of Glass Door, the local homeless charity. We would be hugely grateful for your sponsorship, which you can do by going to the 'what is on page' on our website - or indeed sign up to join us!
