Our Harvest gifts will be going once again to the Upper Room, Providing hot meals, clothing and support for vulnerable people in West London.



Our Stewardship Group will also be speaking to us this week about giving for the work of the Church, and in particular remembering St Mary Abbots in your wills. Our new legacy leaflet can be found at the back of the church, and members of the Group will be on hand for the next week if you would like to ask any questions following the services.

Our preacher at the Family Eucharist on Sunday will be Mike English, the ordinand from St Mellitus College who has been with us on placement for the past month. Mike has been very grateful for the warm welcome he has received at St Mary Abbots and I know that many of you have enjoyed speaking with him about the process of training for the priesthood.
