Sir Gilbert Scott's design for St Mary Abbots

In early 1868, the Vicar of Kensington, Archdeacon Sinclair, commissioned Sir George Gilbert Scott to produce a sketch design of the new Kensington parish church. Scott was probably the most famous and most sought after architect of his day. Scott's first estimate of the cost was for £35,000, though the final figure was closer to £50,000. This was raised by its parishioners. The main building of the church was finished in 1872 and consecrated on 14th May of that year. The spire and tower were not completed until seven and a half years later, a year after Scott's death.

150 YEARS MORE

For our 150th Anniversary projects we intend to install a permanent disabled ramp at the cloister entrance to the church, with a long term project to improve access to facilities in the church and the lighting of the spire and church yard.
