


NEWCOMERS TO OUR CHURCH AND SERVICES

EXCITING NEW MUSICAL PROVISION!

By far the largest of our Sunday congregations is the one that never hears our professional choir - so experimentally on one Sunday a month the professional quartet, at least, will join forces with the voluntary choir and offer two or three anthems/motets in the course of the 9.30 Sung Eucharist. As well as greatly enhancing our liturgy, we hope that this will encourage new singers to join the volunteers. On these Sundays 11.15 Matins will have a single professional cantor to lead the music and explore the under-valued repertoire of solo religious music.

REMEMBERING SEYMOUR DALLAS

The Revd Captain William Loraine Seymour Dallas (1884 – 20th September 1917) was curate of St Mary Abbots from 1908. He volunteered for missionary service in the Alberta Prairies ministering there from 1911-15. During that time he built several churches, including the only other St Mary Abbots in the world, in Barrhead, Alberta. Returning to Great Britain in 1915 he became an Army Chaplain with the rank of Captain and was killed in action on 20th September 1917, two days after his 33rd birthday. A **Service** of **Remembrance** will be held here at 11.00 on Wednesday 20th September -100 years to the day of his death. All are welcome to remember the Revd Captain Dallas and all who perished in the Great War. A Monograph about his life is being prepared written by Steve Atack, Founding Patron of the Friends of St Mary Abbots.

Gary, like me, is a trustee of St Luke's Healthcare for the Clergy and is an honorary consultant to St Luke's. I think you will find him extremely interesting, and I would encourage you to come and listen to him.
