

PREPARING FOR CONFIRMATION

This year's Confirmation will be on Thursday 24th May. We take the process of preparation very seriously, and offer a four-month course of weekly sessions exploring Christian faith and practice, starting very soon and extending through the crucial church seasons of Lent, Eastertide, Ascension and Pentecost. We prepare children from school Year 5, about 9+ in age, and we'll have groups of children, teenagers and adults. Remember, no-one's too old: there are many adults who haven't been confirmed or who, even if they receive the Sacrament, have not shared in this vital process.
