

Remember, no-one's too old: there are many adults who haven't been confirmed or who, even if they receive the Sacrament, have not shared in this vital process. In every recent year, other people have joined these groups once they got underway. One of the advantages of having a full three-and-a-half month preparation period is that it is possible to catch up with what has been missed.
