### Friday 13<sup>th</sup> July: The Diocese Prays for us

Did you know that there is a Diocesan Payer Calendar, organised so that in the course of each year every parish in London is prayed for by our Bishops and all the other churches? It's part of a Calendar of Prayer that encompasses the entire worldwide Anglican Communion – for each day of the year we pray successively for each Diocese, its Bishop and Clergy throughout the world. This coming Friday it's our turn: the whole Diocese will be praying for St Mary Abbots – and you'll see the card that St Paul's Cathedral has sent to assure us of their prayers for our ministry, witness, service to our community and wellbeing.

It has been a glorious **SEASON OF ORDINATIONS** with women and men ordained as deacon or priest into the church's sacred ministry here in our own Diocese and throughout the country. In London no fewer than **39** women and men were ordained Deacon to serve across our Diocese, and some **31** Deacons, women and men, have been ordained as Priest. Do pray for them, for the parishes where they will minster, and that God will continue to raise up Ordinands among us.

NB: The Almighty has only one source of potential clergy: it is the laity, ie: You. I wonder who will be our next St Mary Abbots ordinands? Might one, perhaps, actually be YOU? Why not talk to the clergy?
