CHILDREN ON SUNDAYS RESUMES TODAY!

Today we resume our full provision of ministry to children at our main 9.30 Sung Eucharist

(nb - of course, children are very welcome at ALL our services).

If you're new to our church, we invite children (and parents of pre-school age children) to join in the Introit Procession at the start of the service and gather at the chancel steps for the welcome and introduction to the service (one of our older and more distinguished congregants calls this The Muster!). The children then go out to their respective groups:

CATERPILLARS - 0, 1 & 2 year-olds:

School Dining Room (downstairs)

CHRYSALIS - 3-year-olds & pre-school 4s:

School Main Hall

BUTTERFLIES - School Reception Class & Years 1 & 2:

School Technology Room

JUNIORS - School Years 3 to 7

Vicar's Parlour, above the Church Vestry

This looks organized and prescriptive -but you'll find that in practice there is more flexibility than appears: families fall into many different patterns. Just take your child(ren) to the likeliest groups and talk to the leader who will sort things out!

Remember that for pre-school children we need one parent to stay with the child/ren - but as soon as the children reach the Butterflies it's important that the children work as a group with the Leader and Helper without the distraction of their parents in the room - so you can take part in the service in church. Of course we realise that there are times when a child might need settling and reassurance from parents or carers.
