Friday November 9th

1305 A concert of remembrance in church by the Royal College of Music.

Saturday November 10th

- 1030 onwards war poetry to be read throughout the day in church led by the mayor of the royal borough. The mayor will then adjourn to the war memorial to light the first of 1,000 candles to be lit by the public sponsored by J H Kenyon.
- 1300 An organ recital will take place
- 1500 A full peal of bells will be rung

Sunday November 11th

1050 Short service at the war memorial including the two minutes silence at 1100 followed by full remembrance service in church from 1115 led by Civic Leaders.

Reconciliation – Our Autumn Study Programme

Our third session is this coming Tuesday and focuses on reconciliation within families and organisations. We are pleased to welcome Stephen Fielding, nationally-recognised mediator, to lead us.
