## **Cardinal John Henry Newman**

Last week, the former Anglican, Cardinal John Henry Newman, Victorian priest and poet, was canonised by Pope Francis, in Rome. Newman is the first British Saint of modern times, indeed the first Englishman born since the 1600s to be canonised.

In order for canonisation to take place two miracles must be attributed to the intercession of the saint. Cardinal Newman, to my knowledge, showed no great affinity for the United States of America but it is there that worshippers have benefited from his mediation.
