

 Birth in me the passion for unity and peace so that I may be a good news bearer for all. Amen.

Some of them were remembered for their great deeds, others more for their sins. Give us an open heart to share your unbounded love, and to embrace all who experience discrimination.

Help us to grow in love beyond prejudice and injustice.
