## LENT Ash Wednesday

It is imperative that all Christians make a special effort to receive the Eucharist and imposition of ashes on Ash Wednesday. You can do so before work at 7am Said Eucharist or at the 9.30am School Eucharist or 1.05pm Sung Eucharist or 7.00pm Solemn Eucharist.

Why Ashes? - For centuries, Christians have begun the season of Lent by being marked with the sign of the cross in ash. This sign is a powerful public witness to:

- Our acknowledgement of our own mortality
- · God's power to heal brokenness, in our lives and world
- Our need to respond to God's call to us, to turn to him.

The clergy need help handing out ashing cards 7.30am-8.30am, 12.30pm-1.30pm and 5pm-6pm. Please let us know if you are available.

## Five Top Tips for a Holy Lent

- Prayer carve out an additional five minutes each day to spend in prayer. Set your alarm earlier; don't pick up a paper on the tube; use your lunch break.
- Fasting focus your mind by sacrificing a daily pleasure. Give up meat and heal the planet; say goodbye to twitter; take coffee off the menu.
- Bible delve more deeply into God's word. Commit to reading a psalm each day; read a gospel each weekend; listen to the Bible audiobook on your commute.
- 4. Study Make time for one of our lent events or courses. See above!
- Repent Turn back to God. Make your confession to a priest; ask for forgiveness from those you have wronged; give sacrificially.

## **Teaching English to Refugees**

Connect & Learn is a mentoring scheme matching refugees to volunteers for 121 English language support.

#### Expectation

Depending on availability and needs this could be for 2 hours a week for 6 months, or for longer per week for a shorter amount of time.

#### **Training & Support**

Volunteers will receive induction training on Saturday March 16th (all day) Volunteers will receive on-going support from Migrants Organise staff.

Travel expenses will be provided to volunteers and members.

## Who would benefit from this?

This scheme has been created with people who have additional barriers to learning English; e.g. they find classroom learning difficult due to trauma, they cannot access mainstream education for various reasons such as child care barriers or perhaps they are children who have been outside of the school system for some time. Generally they have very basic and limited English. The 121 support from a volunteer will help build confidence and help overcoming practical barriers.
