

Message from Mother Emma

I do hope that everyone remains safe and well, and able to enjoy this amazing weather to some extent, even if just through open windows!



Yesterday was the Feast of the Ascension, as we remembered the risen Christ ascending into heaven, having spent forty days here on earth after his Resurrection, teaching and encouraging his disciples. It seems very hard to believe that it has already been forty days since Easter, which came so early on in the lockdown. Yesterday should also have been the Confirmation Service for a number of candidates from both St Mary Abbots and our neighbouring parish, St Philip's, Earl's Court Road. Instead, we met last night with the Bishop and the candidates via Zoom, to chall and to pray for them on their continuing Christian journey. Please do keep them in your prayers at this time. We look forward very much to being able to hold the Confirmation Service before too, too long!

As I shall be saying in my sermon this Sunday, in other years there has been a service from the Tower for Ascension Day. as we prayed for and blessed the parish. Due to the new rule that a single clergy person can now enter and film in church. Fr Jonathan ventured alone up the tower and you will see the result, and the parts of the service which he also filmed in church in our "Holy Eucharist for Ascensiontide" this Sunday. It is good to be reminded that St Mary Abbots continues as a House of God, and awaits our return!

Before his Ascension, Jesus promised his disciples that God would send them the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, just ten days later. These days are traditionally days when Christians pray for the coming of the Spirit, and you will see in our newsletter on the website, ideas for prayer for the coming days. Your clergy will be holding you especially in our hearts at this time. "Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful people and kindle in them the fire of your love. Alleluia!"

Thy Kingdom Come' 21st – 31st May

During the 10 days leading up to Pentecost (21-31 May), Christians across the world will be praying for more people to come to know Jesus Christ. This is a huge prayer movement and the Diocese of London are asking Christians across the diocese to sign up for an hour slot in our virtual prayer room, so that we can continuously pray 24 hours a day, for 10 days.

Our new Diocesan vision is 'for every Londoner to encounter the love of God in Christ'. As people contemplate life's big questions over this pandemic, process heartache and search for hope, we pray that they may encounter the love of Christ. New Curate

We are very excited to report that our new Curate in Training, Alice Ormondroyd, will be moving in this week to the flat previously used by Fr Stephen. She has just finished her theological studies, and will complete her formation as a priest here in the parish, learning from all that St Mary



Abbots has to offer, but also bringing to us the fresh eyes and recent theological insight of someone newly ordained. Sadly for Alice, who was supposed to have been ordained on 4th July, the Ordinations for this year have been postponed until the end of September, but Alice will be licensed to preach, teach, lead non-Eucharistic services and offer pastoral care in the parish over the summer, so we will get to know her first through our online services, and then as, God willing, the church re-opens. In September, she will be made Deacon, and then next summer, ordained to the Priesthood, after which she will serve with us for a further two years. It is a great joy and privilege for us as a parish to be able to share in and contribute to this process. We will ask Alice to introduce herself here when she starts.

OTHER NEWS

The Diocese of London have put together a handy prayer tool that will help you in those moments when it can be hard to think of things to pray for. **The 5 finger prayer** will help give you some direction and, as you have your hands with you all the time, you could do this with your family over dinner, before bed or at any point that takes your fancy. For this you simply need your hand. For each finger there is a different category of person that you can pray for together. You could have you children draw around their hand and then write on each finger who they want to pray for.

Thumb: Those closest to your heart – family and friends **Pointer finger**: Those giving direction – teachers,

doctors...etc

Index finger: Those in leadership - Government, business,

church

Ring finger: Those who are weak - sick, poor

Pinky finger: Yourself

Discovering Psalms as Praver
