SUNDAY WORSHIP 10.30 am online

We have decided to go live at **10.30 am**, at the mid-point of our four regular morning services. This new method allows us to have "chat time" too, before and after the service, so if you are able to join us for worship, we shall be around to "speak" to you afterwards as usual – as you serve yourselves tea and coffee! If you arrive early on the site, you can also chat online with one another.

Fr Jonathan and I hope to work closely with Marina and her team, so as to expand our team of volunteers and our list of those in need, so please read her introduction below.

We, however, will be continuing to provide both emotional and spiritual care, both for our own congregation members and locals in the parish who would like a chat. We intend to stay in regular touch, but would also welcome anyone who would like to phone or email us at any point.

POSTPONEMENT OF THE ANNUAL PAROCHIAL CHURCH MEETING

As you may remember, the APCM and the Annual Meeting of Parishioners at which churchwardens are elected, were scheduled in our church calendar to take place on Wednesday 1st April (next week). However, owing to the extraordinary circumstances caused by the Coronavirus which have prevented gatherings from taking place, both of these meetings have had to be postponed.

The Diocese has contacted us to say that special measures have been passed, allowing Annual Parochial Church Meetings to be held later this year, any time up until 31st October 2020. A notice will be publicised in due course with the new date, once this has been decided. Thank you to all those who have contributed reports for the Annual Report, which will be compiled ready for the postponed APCM.

BACH ST JOHN PASSION

As you can imagine, given Government statements about gatherings and the closure of church buildings, we regret to say that the Bach St John Passion will not be going ahead on April 5th as planned. All tickets have been automatically refunded. We are very grateful to those who have contacted us to say they would like to donate the price of the ticket to the church, but we have found that it is quicker and simpler to refund everyone on the list. If you would like to make a donation or to continue your regular plate giving in due course (as some have asked), we shall be sending out a way to do this in due course. We do, however, fully appreciate that this is an uncertain and difficult time for many financially.
