CHURCH ACCESS

Access will only be possible through the cloisters and the south door. Opening the church is dependent upon our maintenance of good practices including:

- maintaining 2 metre distancing from others
- following the one way system
- sanitising our hands at the entrance

The back of the church will be roped off, but the front of the church and the two chapels are available for you to sit and pray. Please be very aware of others praying and avoid sitting near to them. If possible do not use the ends of the pews as this tends to be where everyone sits and it will leave you closer to those passing in the aisle.

Message from Mother Emma

Everyone in the parish office and vestry has been working away to prepare for our return to church worship, and to try to ensure that those who join us on Sunday can do so safely and joyfully. We are also very conscious of all those who are still remaining at home for the time being for whatever reason and you are very much in our thoughts and prayers.

As you will know, we are offering three services initially, and are asking you to sign up in advance on Eventbrite to speed up the process of recording names and contact details for "track and trace". Please do sign up if you can using the link [HERE](#). Entrance and exit will ONLY be through the South Door through the cloister by the flower stall, and there will be a one-way system operating in the church. We are also sorry that we are not yet in a position to offer lavatory provision. We are so grateful for your efforts in observing the national church's guidelines as we come back, and we look forward to further gradual relaxation in what we are and aren't allowed to do!

As you know, I have been shielding because of my kidney transplant. I will be in church on Sunday, but presiding (and waving!) from a distance in the sanctuary, without servers or fellow clergy nearby. I am grateful to Fr Jonathan and to our new curate, Alice (who is also preaching at the Eucharist and singing at Matins) for their help and support in making this possible, and for sharing in our joint return.

We hope very much to be able to provide a recording of one of the services online later on Sunday, and then a voice recording of the two sermons on our YouTube channel on Monday. Please do keep checking, and let us know, if you are watching from home, if you have any feedback.

Our particular prayers this week are for the children of St Mary Abbots as they approach the end of an extraordinary term, and especially for those in Year 6, who are moving on to other schools.
