
The Collect for 18th Sunday after Trinity

It never really gets dark and even on a dead end in Kensington it never really gets quiet. There were spiders, and they found slugs crawling on their faces every time they woke, and the sound of people moving around in the dark. They had some security as a group, somewhere to shelter, loo, and a lovely hot breakfast prepared for us in the morning by Mother Emma and her son Guy - and these are exactly the services that Glassdoor provides, and what the money raised by the sleep out goes towards.

They would like to thank everyone for their kind support and sponsorship which with the other groups sleeping out around London has raised half of the money needed for glassdoor to continue this winter.
