Early call for Christmas Day lunch

As many of you know, St Mary Abbots has hosted for nearly 20 years a Christmas Day lunch party, where some of our most isolated elderly neighbours are invited for a hot turkey feast, carol singing and individually bought presents for our guests. Guests have been referred to us from RBKC social workers and it has been a joyful day made possible by a team of

volunteer drivers and present buyers. Christ Church and St Georges have participated by buying specific present requests submitted by Social Workers.

For Covid 19 reasons, sadly this year we cannot hold our party in the SMA Centre. However, we are investigating how we can avoid disappointment by bringing a turkey dinner and present to our former guests (and new referrals) – our self-styled Deliveroo with an added few minutes of chat.

We will only be able to do this with your help! Here is what we are looking for:

- Volunteers who could take 30 minutes on Christmas Day to deliver a take-away turkey dinner and a Christmas present to a local elderly person. With Covid-safe guests, volunteers might stay for 15 minutes or so for some conversation while the present is opened.
- Present buyers who are not able to drive but would like to participate, write a festive card (fun for children to help), and deliver to the church.
- A few administrative volunteers to help with coordinate getting the presents and drivers together.
