

## Message from Mother Emma

We are delighted to be re-opening the church for public worship this coming Sunday (14<sup>th</sup> March), when there will be services in church at 8 am, 9.30 am and 11.15 am (see poster below). Please do sign up on our website for the services, as we are still required to limit our numbers in order to keep one another safe.



Our 9.30 am will be a Family Eucharist for Mothering Sunday, with our children and mothers leading our readings and intercessions as we give thanks, not only for our mothers, but for everyone who has cared for us over this past difficult year: medical staff, teachers, carers, friends, family and so many others. We also give thanks for God's love and care for us "at all times and in all places" as we remember his holy Church is a mother to us all. Although we shall not be able to give our mothers flowers in church this year due to Covid restrictions, there will be opportunities for young children to decorate flowers, and for all of us to express our thanksgiving amidst the warmth and safety of our church family once again.

For those who are unable or prefer not to venture out just yet, there will be a service of Evening Prayer on Zoom in the evening at 5.30 pm, and Mother Alice's sermon from Matins will be recorded and put up online early next week. For the next two weeks, there will be worship on Sundays only, but from Palm Sunday, we shall be returning to daily worship.

Martina and Mother Alice have really enjoyed the Under 5's Zoom and over 5's YouTube services with our families over the last two months. They are much looking forward to seeing everyone in person again now that the church is open. However, Government regulations state that outdoor children's groups are only able to meet from March 29<sup>th</sup>, so for the next few weeks there will be an activity pack provided for children coming to church, and of course the option to use the long playground if young children need to stretch their legs. Please do remember to sign your children in on the COS register as you arrive at church.

We are all so grateful to our Virgers and volunteers who have enabled us to keep the church open throughout this period for private prayer, and also much appreciate your understanding in following all the Covid-19 restrictions in place at the church, including hand-sanitising, mask-wearing, social-distancing and following the one-way system around the church. We hope and pray that things will continue to improve and that we shall soon be able to welcome everyone back to church as before.
