
In Our Prayers This Week

Message from Mother Emma

Our journey through Holy Week is reaching its culmination in the Great Three Days of Easter, which stretch from the evening Liturgy of Maundy Thursday to our celebrations of the Resurrection on Easter Sunday. It has been



so good to worship with many of you this week both at our church services and online this week, and I look forward very much to sharing with you in the great liturgies of Christ's Death, Passion and Resurrection which lie ahead.

This week I was invited to give a talk on the Liturgies of Holy Week to a group of pastoral assistants from the Kensington Area, (see Sermons page on our website) if you are interested in reflecting further on the days ahead.

You are most warmly invited to share with us in the liturgy of Maundy Thursday which begins at 7 pm (1st April), as we recall the Last Supper and Jesus' arrest in Gethsemane. The Watch before the Altar of Repose will this year conclude at 10 pm.

On Good Friday, during the three hours Jesus hung upon the Cross, we shall begin with an hour of reflections led by the Revd Canon Prof Peter Galloway, Deputy Priest in Ordinary to HM The Queen, interspersed with music and silence. From 1 – 1.30 pm, there will be a time of silence when people may wish to continue to watch before the Cross, before the Liturgy begins at 1.30 pm.

This year, we are holding our Easter Vigil at 7 pm on Holy Saturday, and we shall be baptizing six adults during the service, after we have lit the Easter Fire and the Paschal Candle, and as we begin to celebrate the first signs of the Resurrection with the return of light and beautiful music from our professional choir. Finally, once we have experienced the full story of Christ's Passion, we meet with great joy to celebrate the glory of the Resurrection on Easter Day, with our usual pattern of 8 am Eucharist, 9.30 am Eucharist and 11.15 Matins!

As the regulations now allow, we shall be offering organised children's provision outside during the 9.30 am on Easter Day, and Martina will be in touch with our families about this. For those who would also like them to share in an age-appropriate way in the story of Good Friday, there will be an online version of the Stations of the Cross for children available through our website.

Please remember to sign up for all services via Eventbrite, and kindly observe all our Covid rules to keep our community safe.

The story of the Passion and Resurrection reminds us that Jesus walks with us through the dark times, but faith in him also brings us the promise of eternal hope. This year has had times of great darkness and sorrow, but the events of Easter allow us to fix our eyes on light and hope ahead.
