Dear All,

I am writing this message to you as Mother Emma and Jeremy are on what I'm sure you will agree is a very well-deserved break. It therefore seems fitting that in this week's gospel we hear of Jesus taking his disciples away for a rest. They come to him telling him all that they had done and taught, and how they didn't even have time to eat. Jesus tells them to come away to a deserted place and rest. The one flaw in this plan is that all the people immediately follow.

Mother Emma may be relieved that we have not all followed her on holiday, but as we prepare for school holidays to begin, and for restrictions to lift next week, I think it is important that we think about the importance of rest more generally. We need rest from things, from the many stresses of our lives, but also rest for other things: rest to spend time with those closest to us, rest to expand our minds through reading and travel, and rest to be with God in silence and stillness. It is quite hard to know what to make of our gospel, as it seems that the disciples may not have found the rest that Jesus had in store for them, but after the ravages of the last 18 months, I hope you find time for total rest at some point this summer, without Zooms, calls and all the other things that have crowded out the silence, and that you find space for recovery and for God in their place.

On the subject of restrictions, we are still awaiting the Church of England and the diocese's guidance, but hope to be able to update you soon on what the lifting of restrictions will mean for our worship.

This Sunday we have our first Choral Evensong in a while, at 5.30 p.m. This is a one off for the time being, and we extend a particular welcome to a coachload of people from my old parish in Catford who are coming to see where we've moved to, so please do join us for that (and reserve a place via Eventbrite if you are able to).

If you have not yet returned to church and would value a conversation about coming back, or if you would like a lift to church, please get in touch with one of us.
