## Message from Father Christopher

As we continue to watch with horror the continuing scenes in Kabul, and hear the stories of grief and loss coming out of Haiti, it is important that we ask what we can do to help, as well as keeping those affected in our daily prayers. In our newsletter this week we have highlighted the work of the Red Cross, Christian Aid and UNICEF, all of which I commend to you. A few years ago a friend of mine set up a charity called Refugees at Home, connecting asylum seekers with those with spare rooms, so please do Google that too, or ask me for further details if you might be interested in that kind of direct help.



Jesus has no hands and feet but ours, and the need for greater outreach, both to those in need in Kensington and to those further afield, is something that many of you have spoken about in the conversations we have had so far as part of our Mission Action Planning process. We are in the process of finding dates for the remaining conversations, for a Saturday morning, a weekday evening and after the 9.30 Eucharist one Sunday, so please do keep your eyes open for those when they are announced. In the meantime, please be considering and praying about how we as a church family can best serve Him and all our brothers and sisters. And do not forget to continue to bring food for the Dalgarno Food Bank, which is always very gratefully received!

On the 12<sup>th</sup> we shall celebrate our Patronal Festival, the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. On this day, we shall be offering the regular 8 am BCP Eucharist, a Family Eucharist at 9.30 am and a Festal Eucharist with Choir at 11.15 am, followed by a celebratory parish picnic in the Vicarage garden. At the end of the day, we are delighted to be offering a Choral Evensong at **5.30 pm**.

## St Mary Abbots Friend's News

### Patron & guest speaker banned for life from China

Patron of the Friends of St Mary Abbots, Lord David Alton, has been sanctioned by the Chinese Communist Authorities and banned from entering China for life in punishment for his human rights campaigning. Lord Alton of Liverpool is a Leading Independent Crossbench Peer, Member of the House of Lords International Relations and Defence Committees and established, along with humanitarian lobbying groups and charities, the Foundation for Citizenship and the Roscoe Lectures. Lord Alton is due to speak at a FOSMA event in November on the theme "China and the West: Two Worlds trying to inhabit one Planet". Bearing in mind this recent development, and in light of the ongoing erosion of civil rights in Hong Kong and growing dominance of China, the talk will be worth hearing.
