Message from Mother Emma

It was so wonderful to see so many of you at the various services last Sunday for our Patronal Festival and at the picnic in between. We are so very grateful to people of all ages who took part, reading, singing, leading intercessions, welcoming, setting up and clearing away the picnic, bringing wonderful contributions of food, serving drinks and generally helping us to celebrate our dedication to the Blessed Virgin Mary. We loved being with you all in the church and in the garden.



At the same time, we are so very appreciative of those who have stepped up to welcome the Afghan refugees in this area with generous donations of clothing and essential items and many hours spent sorting and transporting donations and offering practical help and assistance. Fr Christopher has been deeply touched by the overwhelming number of people who have offered help, from the whole St Mary Abbots community, across both church and school. He has asked me to say that as the statutory authorities take on various areas of organization and activity, the urgent need to welcome the refugees is lessening for the time being, but he would like to hold on to the names of all volunteers so as to call on you in due course if he may, particularly once we have established provision for the children in collaboration with other churches. Please do also support the Glass Door sleepout for the homeless on October 1st – either sleeping out or sponsoring one of our intrepid team!

It has been a joy to welcome people back to our midweek services, with the return of Sunday on Monday and the Healing Eucharist this week – please remember that all our weekday Eucharists are now at **12 noon** with the exception of Thursdays, when you are warmly invited to join the School Eucharist at 9.30 am. This Sunday sees the return of the Taizé Eucharist in addition to our regular services on Sunday morning – again, please note change of time to **5.30 pm** - and we hope to see you there!

Last, but absolutely not least, I am delighted to announce a new (but at the same time familiar!) face on our staff team. Most of you will know Martina, who has been a parishioner and volunteer at SMA for many years, and has been working a few hours a week as our Children's Work Administrator for the past year. We are thrilled that she has now taken on a full-time role combining the role of Children's Worker with that of Assistant Virger, working alongside Simon. She has already leapt into action and will bring her particular gifts of practical energy, warmth and faith to our community in a new way!

Sleep Out to support Glass Door 1st October – all night

Our team is assembling to take part in the Glass Door sleep out on the 1st October. For those who do not know what they do, Glass Door is a charity run to cover the area West and South West London. It offers three main services: single rooms with hostel like accommodation, providing meals and 24 hour supervision, hot meals given out to homeless people 7 days a week, and lastly caseworkers providing advice and practical help. Since 2005 the number of people sleeping rough has tripled. People become homeless through a myriad of reasons: loss of job, domestic violence, mental illness, relationship breakdown or death, eviction, cuts to benefits and lack council housing. It could happen to any of us. Glass Door provides people with a chance to eat meals, find clothes, take a shower and wash laundry – things we take for granted.

REV SEYMOUR DALLAS

This week we remember the Reverend Seymour Dallas, Curate of St Mary Abbots and our Missionary to Alberta in the early 1900's killed whilst serving as a Chaplain on the Western Front on September 20th 1917. During his young lifetime the Rev Dallas, who was funded by St Mary Abbots as a Missionary in the early 1900's, singly oversaw the building of a number of churches and schools in rural Alberta including the only other St Mary Abbots church in the world in Bearshead, Alberta. His name can be found inscribed in the panels of our Remembrance Chapel.
