## Volunteers needed for Council Exercise

**Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> November at 1.30pm**

The Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea will be conducting an Emergency response exercise at the St Mary Abbots Centre to practice responding to emergencies. The Centre is one of their emergency locations where a number of people could be accommodated following an evacuation from their properties. They are asking for 10 volunteers to act as evacuees as part of the exercise.

The aim of the exercise is to practice how they would operate an emergency centre in response to a fictitious incident which has caused properties to be evacuated. The exercise will start at 1.30pm with a briefing to participants, which will include the reason you have been evacuated, expectations during the exercise and a safety briefing. The live part of the exercise will finish at 4.30pm and this will be followed by a debrief so they can learn from your experience how to improve their responses. The exercise will finish no later than 5pm.
