
### **Churches of Jerusalem and Christian Unity Talk Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> January 2022, 7pm**

Kensington Council of Churches and Churches Together invite you to a 'Week of prayer for Christian Unity' Service on the 20<sup>th</sup> January 2022. Hosted this year by the Rev'd Sally Rogers at the Kensington United Reformed Church, Allen Street, London, W8 6BL the service starts at 7pm and Father Christopher will be preaching.

The week of prayer runs from the 18<sup>th</sup> to 25 January and this year resources have been prepared by the Churches of the Middle East "The story of the Magi visiting the Holy Family in Bethlehem is one very familiar to us. The Magi have sometimes been seen as a symbol of the world's diversity – different religions and cultures – that comes to pay homage to the Christ-child. The story might therefore represent the unity of all created that God desires. The churches of the Middle East, the history of which was, and still is, characterised by conflict and strife, tainted with blood and darkened by injustice and oppression offer these resources conscious that the world shares many of the travails and much of the difficulties that it experiences, and yearns for a light to lead the way to the Saviour who is the light that overcomes darkness." For each daily reflection there will be a 'go and do' action point prepared by Christian Aid lining into their work to tackle poverty and injustice.
