## Message from Mother Emma

We are now in Passiontide, the final two weeks before Easter. This morning, Fr Christopher and I were privileged to be involved in the St Mary Abbots School Passion Play, in which every child in the school took part, and which was a deeply moving re-enactment of the events of Holy Week.



This Sunday, we celebrate Passion Sunday, and will see the cross and images veiled in purple as we approach this solemn time. We hope you will be able to join us at the Eucharist, or at Matins, at which Fr Peter Galloway will be preaching. The following Sunday (Palm Sunday), 10<sup>th</sup> April, is the start of Holy Week, and we shall be meeting at the West Doors of the church at 9.30 am to process outside the church as we remember Jesus' Triumphant Entry into Jerusalem, before we hear the dramatized reading of the Passion Story. In the event, there are still tickets available for the performance of Parts 2 and 3 of Handel's Messiah, which will also be a beautiful and evocative reminder of this story.

Looking ahead through Holy Week, there will be a devotional address at the 12 noon Eucharist on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, which will then be put up online within a service of Night Prayer for those unable to attend during the day. On Maundy Thursday, Fr Peter Galloway will be presiding at the 10.30 am BCP Eucharist. We then enter into the Triduum (the Great Three Days), which includes the Maundy Thursday service at 8 pm, the Three Hours from 12 noon on Good Friday and the Easter Vigil with Baptism at 8pm on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup>, before we meet to celebrate the glorious Easter Eucharist on Easter Day and greet Christ as he rises from the dead. Please do join us for as many of these services as you are able – it is hard to experience the full joy of Easter without first experiencing at least some of the sad solemnity of Holy Week on the way. Our professional choir will be singing for all these services.

As we look beyond Easter, we shall be starting to mark the 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of our Gilbert Scott building this year, beginning with a service on 15<sup>th</sup> May at 11.15 am, remembering the original Dedication of the building on 14<sup>th</sup> May 1872. The Preacher will be the Ven Richard Frank, the Archdeacon of Middlesex. Please save this date in your diaries, along with the date of our 150<sup>th</sup> Patronal Festival on 11<sup>th</sup> September at 11.15, at which the Bishop of London will come to the church for her first visit to preach and preside at a Festal Eucharist. Events will be held and advertised to mark the anniversary throughout this year – please watch this space!

If you are travelling or away for the holidays, please know that you are in our prayers, and please also take our love and blessings to any church you visit. We hope that you will have a reflective Holy Week and a joyful Easter when it comes.
