


In Our Prayers This Week

I start with some news from the staff team: Adam Norton, who has been Manager of St Mary Abbots Centre since June 2011, has decided that the time has come for him to retire at the end of this month. He is very sad to be leaving St Mary Abbots after so many years (and we are sad to see him go!), but he is looking forward to being able to spend much more time with his family. We are all so grateful to Adam for the positivity and cheerfulness he has brought to the job; dealing with our varied Hall bookings, maintaining the Centre for our use and offering calm and unfailing help to those who hire spaces, with all their different needs and requests. Many of you will have encountered Adam through birthday party bookings, Church Fairs and other events, and perhaps the event we most associate with him – the November Bonfire Party! Adam's final evening at St Mary Abbots will be at this year's Bonfire Party (Friday 4th November) when we look forward to thanking him and bidding him farewell in a very appropriate setting.



We shall be collecting for a goodbye present for Adam over the next couple of weeks. This year we shall be holding our All Souls Service at 5.30 pm on Sunday 30th October. At this service, we remember all those who have gone ahead of us into God's heavenly kingdom; the choir will sing movements from Duruflé's Requiem and we shall read out the names of the departed before God's altar. If you would like the name of someone recently departed to be remembered at this service, please let Leonora know, or write the name (clearly in capitals so we get it right!) on the forms at the church entrance.

In our wider outreach, Fr Christopher is still looking for anyone who might be able to host a Ukrainian refugee family with children at our school (or other local schools) to prevent them from having to move away from the area. Please do get in touch with him if this is something you could consider. And if you haven't yet sponsored our Sleep Out team raising money for the homeless, their website is still open for donations. They are hugely grateful to all those who have already sponsored them.

Heavenly Father, you are the source of all goodness, generosity and love. We thank you for opening the hearts of many to those who are fleeing for their lives. Help us now to open our arms in welcome, and reach out our hands in support. We pray that the desperate may find new hope, and lives torn apart be restored.
