


In Our Prayers This Week

We do hope that you are managing to stay warm in this very cold weather! As we have mentioned in one of my earlier messages the PCC voted to keep the church heated for those seeking a warm and peaceful space, so if you would like to please do come, or encourage others, to spend some time warming up in the church which is open daily from 8.30 am – 6 pm, (and from 10 - 6 on Saturdays).



As we continue to move through the Sundays of Epiphanytide we hope very much that you will be able to join us for at least one of our wonderful Choral Services as we celebrate the Feast of Candlemas next Sunday (29th January).

We are very excited about our new Children's Choir, which will first be singing at the Family Eucharist on Sunday 5th February. If your child would be interested in joining for a brief rehearsal before the Eucharist and then singing with the choir during the Distribution of Communion, please email Mother Alice.

We are delighted that Fr Jonathan MacNeaney, our former Associate Vicar, will be collated as Vicar at the church of St Mary and St John the Divine, Balham, on 30th January in the evening. If you are planning to attend, please could you let Leonora know, so we can inform the parish, and also in case we might make a plan to travel there together.

The season of Lent is now fast approaching, and we hope to base our Lenten study around the story of the Prodigal Son. To help us with this, Emma Windsor-Liscombe, a member of our Matins congregation, will be acting as our artist-in-residence during Lent, and will be creating a painting for us in the Holland Chapel to help our reflections. We look forward to sharing more details about her work for this and also about the possibility of a discussion group in due course – please watch this space! You can read more about Emma and her plans further down in this newsletter.

If you have been wondering why the Garth and much of the East Churchyard is roped off, we were dismayed when a chunk of masonry fell from the tower in a high wind, and are keen not to take any risks! A spire specialist has been booked in for 20th February to restore this and to check that everything else is safely fixed on(!) before we re-open the garden. Lent Artist in Residence

Emma Windsor-Liscombe is originally from Vancouver. She has studied at the University of British Columbia, and is now at the Royal College of Art. She has exhibited at several galleries and won a grant from The Vancouver Foundation.

Over Lent Emma will be painting in the Holland Chapel, although not every day, and would be delighted for you to come and watch her paint and see how the work develops. We will be showing some of Emma's preliminary works, along with her thought process behind creating this work which will be based on the story of The Prodigal Son. Emma writes:

"I am an interdisciplinary artist with a practice based in painting and drawing. I work predominantly in oil, charcoal, and reclaimed materials. My art explores narratives of trauma, addiction, spirituality and the environment. Currently, I am interested in depicting ancient myth, stories of women from my family, and a contemporary visualization of my own myth. I explore these themes through narrative scenes, portraiture, and sculpture".
