We continue to celebrate the resurrection of Our Lord during these 50 days of Eastertide, and this Sunday in our gospel reading we hear about Jesus as the gate to the sheepfold. We're used to hearing about Jesus as



the good shepherd, but hearing about Him as a gate takes a bit more imagination! This probably comes from the practice of shepherds lying across the sheepfold in order to keep their sheep safe. Jesus doesn't just keep us safe however. Our reading goes on to tell us that Jesus welcomes us in so that we might also go out, and that He has come so that we might have life, and life in all its fulness.

I want to take this opportunity to thank you for the fulness of life which you bring to our church family, and which I hope we together bring to those beyond our church in the wider community. There are as ever lots of ways to get more involved, and please do ask if you are interested in talking to one of us about what God might be calling you to contribute as part of our community.

Mother Emma will no doubt be reminding you next week about all of our celebrations for the coronation, but please do see below for details of our celebratory Civic Service the evening before, or our Family Eucharist with children's choir (contact Mother Alice if your child would like to take part) and Choral Matins on the Sunday. There will also be a special peal of bells as we join the national 'Ring for the King', and a street party in Holland Street.
