Last week we became members of the Major Churches Network. This is a group of 320 of the largest churches in England, recognised by both the Church and the state. To qualify the church must be "*physically very large* (*over 1000m2 footprint, Grade I or II or*

(exceptionally) II listed, with Exceptional architectural or historic significance and with a role beyond that of a typical parish church, making a considerable civic, cultural and/or economic contribution to the wider community". This follows on from becoming, since the start of the year, members of Inclusive Church, The Prayer Book Society, YMIC youth group, signing up to be a living wage employer and last month being granted our Eco Bronze Eco Award as part of Eco Church.
