
In our Prayers this week

Rev'd Seymour Dallas, Curate of St Mary Abbots

Wedneday <u>20th</u> September marks the 105th anniversary of the death of the Rev. Seymour Dallas, curate of St Mary Abbots. He was sent by our church to Alberta, a remote part of Canada, and in 3 years he established many schools and 5 churches, the one in Barrhead,

Laudonia Concert – Report

chaplain-and-missionary-killed-in-action-100-years-ago

Last Friday (8th September) we hosted a wonderful concert by Scottish Baroque ensemble Laudonia, with soprano Susan Hamilton. The theme was the Grand Tour to Rome of Sir John Clerk of Penicuik, later a signatory of the 1706 Treaty of Union between England and Scotland. As well as being treated to virtuoso performances of works by Corelli, Draghi and others that John Clerk might have known, and one of his own cantatas, Leo Scotius Irritatus (the Lion of Scotland Enraged), the audience was introduced to baroque instruments such as the theorbo (you may need to look that up!).
