It is with great excitement that we see the progress on our Access Project. The internal wooden ramp to the Holland Chapel, blessed by the Bishop on her visit, now makes it possible for everyone to join in when we have refreshments or Bible Studies there, and we can now also offer a dedicated space for wheelchair users close to the front of the church for concerts and services alike. The stone ramp outside the South Door is also taking shape before our eyes, and I am very grateful to the Friends who made both of these possible. The final stage of this project to make us fully welcoming is to re-hang and alter the doors, so that access will be much easier, and this will be started shortly. We are still fundraising for this final stage, so if you feel able to contribute, please do either contact Petter in the parish office, or use one of the QR codes in church. Leonora is documenting the whole timeline of this project on the boards in church and on the 'what is on' page of the website.

As we continue to expand our welcome to all through the generosity and support of our church family, we remember the prayer of Bishop Thomas Ken (1637-1711): O God, make the door of this house wide enough to receive all who need human love and fellowship, and a heavenly Father's care; and narrow enough to shut out all envy, pride and hate. Make its threshold smooth enough to be no stumbling block to children, nor to straying feet, but rugged enough to turn back the tempter's power: make it a gateway to thine eternal kingdom. Amen.
