Message from Mother Emma

It was, as ever, a privilege to celebrate Christmas with you and with so many visitors from all over the world. I hope that those of you who were travelling



were also able to celebrate the Nativity with joy, and to experience some peace and rest amidst the festivities. We welcome you back as we come this weekend to the end of the Christmas season with the arrival of the Magi at the Crib, and we shall be celebrating the Epiphany on Sunday with a Family Eucharist at 9.30 am and at all our other regular Sunday services.

I wonder whether I might ask you, at this time of year when we remember the abundant gifts of the Magi to the Christ child, to reflect on your own charitable and church giving for the year ahead. We have been very grateful for your generous offerings in 2023 to sustain the work of our church. Besides some wonderful one-off development projects – among them the beautiful new access arrangements at the South Door and the external lighting – we have, perhaps even more importantly, been able to lead people of all ages in praising God through uplifting music and worship; to maintain our historic church building and to reach out to serve our neighbours in the community.

The PCC is now setting its budget for 2024, and we very much hope to be able to maintain and expand all the ways in which we regularly serve God and his people here in Kensington. As you may be aware, we do not receive any external funding, so we are largely dependent on your generosity to cover our regular expenditure (music, heating, children's work resources, staff costs, buildings maintenance etc). Like everyone in the current climate, we are experiencing higher costs and we are producing a leaflet showing some of our regular costs which will be available in church throughout January and will shortly be up on the website. We will be sharing some further thoughts about our planning with you in church during Epiphanytide.

As you prayerfully consider your level of giving for 2024, please could I specifically ask you to consider two ways of making your giving as effective as possible for the church:

- Firstly, if you usually give by cash or card machines, would you instead be able to give monthly or quarterly by standing order, so that the PCC can have a clearer idea of what our income for the year will look like? (Cards stating, "I give by standing order" are available at the door to put into the collection plates if you do so.)
- Secondly, if you are a regular giver of any kind and are a UK taxpayer, could you fill out a Gift Aid form, which allows us to claim an additional 25% on any donations you make to the church, without any extra cost to you?

Both Standing Order and Gift Aid forms are available in church, or can be found HERE. If you are able and have not

yet done so, please do fill them in and return them to the sidespeople or to the Parish Office in person or online. It will make a significant difference to our ability to plan financially for the year ahead if more people do one or both of these things, on top of any additional giving you feel able to offer this year. If you are not yet a giver, please do consider making a regular offering to support our worship, outreach and historic building. Thank you for being a part of the Body of Christ here at St Mary Abbots and for your generosity in sustaining all that we do in God's name and to God's glory.
