### Dr JOAN MARTIN MBE

It is several weeks now since our beloved friend Joan died at the great age of 102 – but because of the large number of key people who need to be involved in her funeral, the service has had to be kept back to this week. Her body will be brought into church on Wednesday at 5.00pm to lie overnight in the Resurrection Chapel, and the funeral itself will be on Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> February at 11.00am. Her great friend Bishop Michael Colclough, former Bishop of Kensington, will conduct the service and there will be contributions from those who worked alongside and were inspired by her, and many of the clergy who ministered to her over the years.

She was known by all at St Mary Abbots and far beyond as a wonderful example to us all of self-giving Christian witness and service. As a junior doctor she dealt with one of the most horrific civilian tragedies of WWII, the Bethnal Green tube disaster, worked faithfully as a local GP and received the MBE for her remarkable work of swimming therapy with the disabled. The national importance of her contribution to the good of society, especially those in greatest need, was marked by Obituary notices in both the Times and the Telegraph – they managed to dig up material that we hadn't heard before, proving that her life was even richer than we thought, and are well worth reading.

## FEBRUARY 14<sup>th</sup> IS ASH WEDNESDAY

After Good Friday, this is the most solemn day of the church's year, when all Christians will want to reflect on their relationship with God and turn again to experience his mercy and forgiveness.

In addition to Morning and Evening Prayer we offer three Eucharist in the course of the day, so one of these times must suit you!

At each of these services we offer the **IMPOSITION OF ASHES**, the marking of our foreheads with ash as a sign that we acknowledge our own mortality and wish to turn away from our sins and follow Christ

**7.00am Early Morning EUCHARIST**

then later in the day our main services are:

**1.05pm SUNG EUCHARIST**

deliberately kept within an hour so that people can come in their lunchbreak

**7.00pm SOLEMN EUCHARIST**

Our main service of the day, with a Homily by Fr Jonathan The music at both of these services will be led by our professional choir, and will include the famous **ALLEGRI Miserere**

## THE HOLY SEASON OF LENT

We will once again offer a full provision of worship, study and events to encourage us all to keep this holy season as a time of renewing and deepening our knowledge of God, our Discipleship of Jesus, and our membership of his servant church.

It's not just about giving up chocolate, crisps and alcohol, a kind of spiritual slimming diet. The Lenten fast is an act of discipline to be embraced with joy, a time of simplification of our lives so that we can focus on what really matters, our relationship with God and our service of others. We keep this holy season as a time of renewing and deepening our knowledge of God, our Discipleship of Jesus, and our membership of his servant church.

This year our Lent Course will be rather unusual:

### CONVERSATIONS IN LENT

As he approaches the end of his full-time parochial ministry your Vicar is, with customary self-indulgence, organising a series of conversations in church with some of the marvelous people he has come to know over the last 40 years, people prominent in public life. They will talk about their work, their values and convictions. It's deliberately not ostensibly a religious exercise – many of our guests would hesitate to wear that label – but I am convinced that their stories and work will intersect with our faith and give us much to think about in our own story, and how we live out our lives. Unfortunately there is still a slight overlapping of dates so I can't publish the full list of speakers this Sunday, but the sessions will be held in church, starting with a light supper at 7.30, and on the five middle Thursdays in Lent:

**February 22; March 1, 8, 15 & 22.**

As a hint of the kind of speakers we will welcome, we're delighted that one of them will be the Executive Chairman of ITV and former Chair of the Arts Council Sir PETER BAZALGETTE. Book the dates now!

## PREPARING FOR CONFIRMATION

We take the process of preparation very seriously, and offer a four-month course of weekly sessions exploring Christian faith and practice, extending through the crucial church seasons of Lent, Eastertide, Ascension and Pentecost, with the Confirmation itself on May 24<sup>th</sup>. We prepare children from school Year 5, about 9+ in age, and we'll have groups of children, teenagers and adults. Remember, no-one's too old: there are many adults who haven't been confirmed or who, even if they receive the Sacrament, have not shared in this vital process. The weekly study and discussion groups explore the major themes of Christian belief and practice, so we may play our full part in the church's life. See the clergy for more details.
