Message from Mother Emma

Thank you all for your continued support of St Mary Abbots, through worship, regular contact, friendship and donations. We are thankful that our community has stayed so strong and faithful, and hope and pray that our shared faith continues to give us strength and hope in this crisis.



Online Services from within the Church

Along with the slight amendments to the lockdown, there has also been much debate around the slow stages to re-open our churches. The Bishop of London has now announced that it is permissible for a member of the clergy to enter the church alone to pray for the parish and to record or livestream material for online services. It currently looks as though churches may be permitted to open for private prayer in July, though this is clearly dependent on Government decisions and the course of the virus.

You will be aware that to my great sadness and frustration, I have been told by the NHS, (because my historic kidney transplant puts me at extremely high risk of complications from Covid-19), to continue to "shield" in my house for the time being. In order that I may, as Vicar, continue to share in leading the worship of the parish, the plan is that we shall be providing a mixture of online services, some from within the church and some, as currently, from the Vicarage garden. I am glad and grateful that this means Fr Jonathan will be able to go into church, so that you will be able to see St Mary Abbots being used for its rightful purpose and know that you are being prayed for before the altar, but hope that you understand my situation. I am glad to announce that next Sunday's Ascensiontide service (24th May) will feature elements both from the church and from the garden.

I share in your sadness that we can't yet go back and worship together, and yet I am uplifted that we worship spiritually together week by week, and will continue to do so. Please be

Confirmation Candidates Thursday 21st May 2020

This coming Thursday, Ascension Day, the Bishop of Kensington was to hold a Service of Confirmation here at St Mary Abbots. Sadly, due to Covid-19, this service has had to be postponed. Many of you will remember our commissioning of the candidates some months ago, and we ask that you keep them in your prayers this week as their journey in faith continues, and as they wait for the time when they can confirm that faith before God in our presence at St Mary Abbots.

New Curate

Mother Emma was asked if St Mary Abbots would take on a part-time curate in Training, who would complete her formation as a priest here in the parish, learning from all that St Mary Abbots has to offer, but also bringing to us the fresh eyes and recent theological insight of someone newly ordained. She was delighted (with the support of the churchwardens) to accept this offer, and our new curate, **Alice Ormondroyd**, will be moving into Fr Stephen's former flat on May 25th. Sadly for Alice, who was supposed to have been ordained on 4th July, the Ordinations for this year have been postponed until the end of September, but Alice will be licensed to preach, teach, lead non-Eucharistic services and offer pastoral care in the parish over the summer, so we will get to know her first through our online services, and then as, God willing, the church re-opens. In September, she will be made Deacon, and then next summer, ordained to the Priesthood, after which she will serve with us for a further two years. It is a great joy and privilege for us as a parish to be able to share in and contribute to this process. We will ask Alice to introduce herself here next week.

Archbishop Justin Welby has set up a phone line for those who wish to worship but can not use the internet. Callers will hear a special greeting from the Archbishop of Canterbury before being about to choose from a range of options including hymns, prayers, reflections and advice on COVID-19. The number to dial is **0800 804 8044**.

Archbishop Justin said: "With many in our country on lockdown, it's important that we support those who are feeling lonely and isolated, whatever age they are. The Daily Hope service will allow people to hear hymns, prayers and words that offer comfort and hope, especially in this Easter season. I want to urge people to spread the news about this service.
