## A Week of Accompanied Prayer

Do you work in the City of London? Do you long to take a little time out to reflect on your life but for one reason or another are unable to get away? The London Centre for Spiritual Direction in Lombard Street is offering an opportunity to step back and take a look at your life in a "A Week of Accompanied Prayer."

Weeks of Accompanied Prayer work around your routine and responsibilities - a bit like taking a retreat within your daily life. During the week, you will be given the opportunity to try different ways of praying with material suited to your personal needs, and you will be guided as to how to go about it. Over five days, you will be invited to try to pray with the material on your own for half an hour a day, and you will meet with a trained spiritual director for up to half an hour a day who will support you.

### Safeguarding

In the light of recent reports and the multitude of brave survivors sharing their stories, bishop Sarah wrote to the clergy of London Diocese last week saying:

"The Church is called to reflect the nature of Jesus Christ, the nature of God, and I believe that our churches should be places of safety - places in which people can seek and find refuge. Yet, I have heard such deeply saddening stories from survivors of abuse, including where we have got it wrong in the past. While as a Church and a Diocese we continue to make progress in our safeguarding practices, those harrowing stories must drive our commitment to a safe Church."

May I take this opportunity to reassert our commitment as a church to safeguarding vulnerable children and adults. May I also remind you that all Christians have a responsibility to speak out in any situation in which they believe there may be a safeguarding concern.
